8. Health Insurance and Overseas Travel Accident Insurance

National Health Insurance (paid by the student)

If you get sick or injured during your stay in Japan, National Health Insurance makes it possible to receive medical treatment by only paying part of the medical expenses (partial obligation). In principle, it is possible to receive medical treatment with the payment of just 30% of the total medical care expenses. Exchange students are obligated to buy the National Health Insurance.

Personal Accident Insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS) (paid by the University)
The Personal Accident insurance for Students Pursuing Education and Research (PAS) is taken out collectively so that a minimum level of insurance benefits can be received if an unexpected accident or disaster occurs during education or research that results in injury.
